2017-2018....A Year in Review

As we transition from one school year to the next, I feel it is important to reflect on some of the outstanding events and accomplishments at Huntington North High School during the 2017-2018 school year. Space will not permit me to include them all, but here are a few highlights:

*The Class of 2018 earned \$2.7 million dollars in college scholarships....and still counting.

*The Class of 2018 gave to two local charities with their senior class gift totaling over \$10,000.

*The Viking Athletic Program earned the Northeast 8 All-Conference trophy! Points are earned by each athletic team for their rank in the conference standings, and our school placed 1st in the overall standings.

*While final calculations are still being determined for our official graduation rate for the Class of 2018, we are confident that we will again far exceed the 90% threshold and surpass the Indiana state average.

*We offered our students a robust curriculum, including 13 advanced placement courses and over 60 dual credit courses/programs.

*Nearly 300 students were enrolled in half day Career and Technical Education Programs.

*30 Huntington North juniors led a program called "Operation Impact" that mentored 5th grade elementary students in the areas of self-esteem, leadership, and decision-making.

*The Student Council began a new tradition for seniors, providing an opportunity to paint their own parking space in our student parking lot. The project received state-wide attention and even generated inquiries from Europe!

*The Class of 2018 embarked on the first-ever “Senior Walk” for Huntington North High School. On their last student day, graduating seniors were able to walk through HNHS and the elementary school they attended in their caps and gowns.

*15 graduating seniors wore a red, white, and blue braided cord at our commencement ceremony, recognizing them for their enlistment into a branch of military service upon graduation. This is the first time in HNHS history that we have recognized those that will serve in the military during our commencement ceremony.

*Our Top 25 graduating seniors in the Class of 2018 all had above an 11.0 grade point average

*More student-athletes earned distinction as a scholar athlete than any other time in HNHS history.

*A Viking Ambassadors Program was initiated to engage community leaders and members in all of the happenings at HNHS. The Ambassadors were informed of programs/courses at HNHS and provided feedback to provide direction in better serving our students and community.
