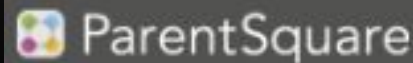

- \*Work-based experience

- \*Service-based experience

Step 3: Demonstrate you are college/career ready through test scores, curriculum or certifications

Can be applied to graduating classes prior to 2023 as appropriate

	2 credits: Algebra I 2 credits: Geometry 2 credits: Algebra II <i>Or complete Integrated Math I, II, and III for 6 credits. Students must take a math or quantitative reasoning course each year in high school</i>
Science	<b>6 credits</b>
	2 credits: Biology I 2 credits: Chemistry I or Physics I or Integrated Chemistry-Physics 2 credits: any Core 40 science course

# Diploma Type-Academic Honors

\*All Core-40 Requirements plus...

2 advanced **Math** credits

6 Credits of one **World Language**

or 4 credits each of two different languages

2 **Fine Arts** credits

4 credits in two or more **AP courses** and take corresponding AP Exams (or) **6 college credits** from the approved dual credit list.

Earn a Grade of C- or higher in courses that count towards diploma and have a GPA of 8.25/11.0 (Class of 2023/2024) or 2.7/4.0 (Class of 2025 and beyond) or higher

# Diploma Type-Technical Honors

\*All Core-40 Requirements plus...

Earn 6 credits in an approved career pathway and complete one of the following:

- Earn a state approved certification (or) 6 transcribed dual credits from the approved list

Earn a Grade of C- or higher in courses that count towards diploma and have a GPA of 8.25/11.0 (Class of 2023/2024) or 2.7/4.0 (Class of 2025 and beyond) or higher

Complete any one of the options of the C40 AHD (A-F)\*

# Post-Secondary Testing Options

## Military Entrance Exam

- ASVAB can be administered during a student's Junior or Senior year (can also be set up by a recruiting officer)



## College Entrance Exams

- All 10th graders will take the PSAT during the Fall.
- Practice for future college entrance exams and helpful in gaining dual credits during Junior and Senior year
- SAT/ACT during 11th grade
- Starting with the Class of 2023, ALL Juniors will take the SAT during the Spring per the Indiana Department of Education

# Dual Credit @ HNHS

Dual Credit means that a student is earning college credit while also earning high school credits. These classes are taught at HNHS by an instructor that has been trained and approved by the institution providing the Dual Credit.

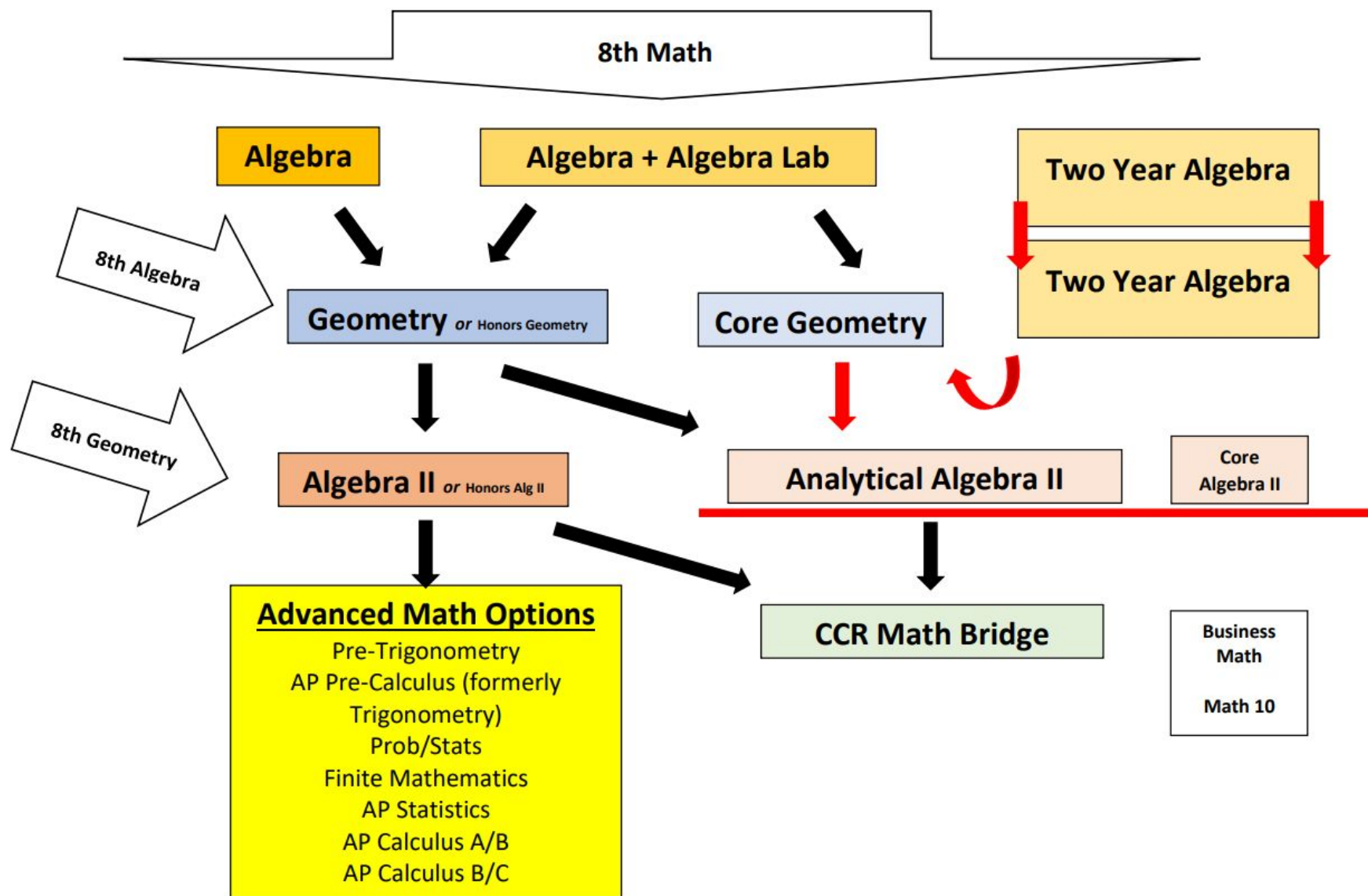
